Whatever you've been doing to keep the hurricanes away, please continue. Wouldn't it be wonderful to go through a summer without strapping down your boat and preparing for a storm? I don't want to curse us, we still have a ways to go, but there's hope.

The city of Cape Coral recently gave us the privilege of spending \$1500 to install a water backflow preventer. I think it's another way for them to make more permit dollars. All commercial buildings are now required to have these devices. Here's the interesting part: We tried to get permission to install it next to the building and out of the way. Of course they said we couldn't and it is now installed in front of the building next to the sidewalk. So much for common sense. A few of us took out the pavers for the plumber and then we reinstalled them after the project was completed. We also fixed a few low spots out front. Have you harassed a manatee lately?

Sitting at a meeting the other day, the person sitting next to me was telling a story about their neighbor. It seems the neighbor was trying to attract some manatees to their dock with a water hose. So, I asked, did you tell them it was illegal? Unfortunately, I was not surprised when they replied, "I didn't know that." So, then I asked, have you taken America's Boating Course? The answer was "no, I have a captains license."

It seems that in captains' school they must not cover Florida laws. Manatees are a threatened species and are protected by federal and state laws. Under Florida law that type of activity is considered harassment.

In the past it used to be a requirement that all members of the Power Squadron take America's Boating Course. The course provided all members with a baseline of knowledge. Not just about boating in general, but information about federal, state, and local laws along with information about what you need to know about local waters.

So, what do all of us in Florida need to know about manatees? Lots, but let's look at the basic protections as Lee County has its fair share of manatees. We have so many manatees for two reasons, the sea grass and the powerplant. When the snowbirds come south, the manatees migrate to the powerplant between the Caloosahatchee and Orange rivers where they find warm water in the winter months.

The many speed zones throughout the county are there specifically for the protection of manatees and in many cases the seagrass they eat. It's a good idea to know where those zones are. You can download a PDF from MyFWC.com of the state and federal manatee protection areas, https://myfwc.com/media/7302/leempz-brammaps.pdf.

If you don't want to be guilty of harassment, DO NOT:

- give food to manatees,
- use water to attract manatees to your boat, dock, or marina (etc.) where manatees may be harmed,
- separate a cow and her calf,
- disturb manatee mating herds,
- pursue manatees or chase them from warm water sites,
- disturb resting manatees,
- hit, injure, or harm manatees,
- jump on, stand on, hold on to, or ride manatees,
- grab or kick manatees,
- block a manatee's path if one or more moves

toward you,

- hunt or kill manatees,
- use your vessel to pursue or harass manatees,
- "fish" for or attempt to hook or catch manatees.

Under the law, any act that disrupts a manatee's normal behavior is punishable by a fine of up to \$50,000, one year imprisonment, or both. If you witness any of these actions you can report them to Wildlife Alert and get a reward. Wildlife Alert is a nonprofit program created to encourage citizens to report fish, wildlife and boating violations. To report these activities you can either call the Wildlife Alert Hotline at 888-404-FWCC (888-404-3922 or submit a tip at MyFWC.com/WildlifeAlert. Rewards up to \$1,000 are offered for various violations. Pictures and videos are helpful in the prosecution of the offenders.

In the \$300 Reward category are,

- Level Two Violations as defined in F.S. 379.401 such as:
- o Unlawfully taking small game or any saltwater finfish, shellfish, or crustaceans,
- o Feeding or enticement of alligators or crocodiles,
- o Molesting endangered/threatened species,
- o Taking protected wildlife species (i.e. migratory birds)
- Possession of captive wildlife without the required permit
- Boating under the influence (BUI)
- Misdemeanor violation of the Florida litter law

SQUADRON EDUCATION OFFICER (SEO)

So far, so good!

Only two months to go before end of hurricane season. Even though it's been quiet in our little corner of the world, we need to remain vigilant. Historically, October has been the peak month for tropical cyclones here in Florida. They tend to form closer to us in the Caribbean or Gulf. This means we won't get as long a notice, so be sure you're ready to implement your plan.

The October education offerings are in place and available for registration. Here's a synopsis:

- 1. Boat Handling: Rules of the Road seminar will be on Tuesday, October 7, 2025, at 7 PM in room 202. This is the first of the Boat Handling two-hour seminars. It provides an introduction to all the rules and regulations that all boaters must follow when on the water. Attendees will also be provided with a digital copy of the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea (COLREGS). All boaters are expected to be familiar with rules. Indeed, anyone renewing a boat registration must attest to this. And any vessel of 39.4 ft (12 m) or greater must carry a copy, either paper or digital (digital versions must be produced within one minute of request from law enforcement) of the COLREGS on board (this applies to a small subset of our members). Online registration is available online at the Squadron website from the Classes button;
- 2. Local Waters Seminar will be held Tuesday, October 14, 2025 at 7 PM in room 202. In a mere two hours you will be introduced to the area's history and specific boating information not found anywhere else. Registration available online at the Squadron website from the Events/Seminars button and there are still plenty of seats available;

- 3. Navigating SW Florida: A Guide for Recreational Boaters seminar series starts Tuesday, October 21, 2025 at 2 PM in room 203. This sixweek series of two-hour classes provides a more in-depth treatise of the material covered in the Local Waters Seminar. In addition, it includes detailed information on how to navigate using computers, tablets, and smart phones. Registration is available online at the Squadron website from the Classes button;
- 4. Marine Navigation course will begin Tuesday, October 7, 2025 at 7 PM in room 203. This series of eight two-hour classes provides a very detailed study into electronic navigation techniques. The skills learned in this course can be immediately applied to safe boating in our local area. Visit areas you've never been to with confidence knowing that you can get there and back safely. Registration is available online at the Squadron website using from the Classes button.


ABC begins on November 3, and the docket for seminars and courses, all starting in January 2026, will be posted in the next Buoys. The full calendar is available on the Squadron website.

Integrating Marine Electronics – Using NMEA 0183 & 2000




On Thursday, October 9, we will be presenting a new Seminar under final development by the Boat Systems Committee (BSC). Virtually all new boats in the 25' and above class come equipped with GPS, Chart Plotter or MFD capabilities, and other instrumentation. In most cases, some of the magic that helps bring all this information together is provided by a NEMA2000 electronic network. Focus of this seminar includes what is NEMA2000, what capabilities does it enable, and how it all works. We will cover the basic concepts of networking in the marine environment, some implementation basics and some hints on what to look for when the display goes blank. Does your Chart Plotter also display Engine parameters? We'll cover some additions you may wish to consider to enhance your operational awareness while underway. Ever wondered how you could add AIS to your helm? We'll cover the basics.

There is no test at the end of this seminar, but there is a survey. The BSC needs your input on how deep into this technology you, the members, are interested in digging.
