It's that time of year where we reset out officers, plans and focus. Our new fiscal year starts on March 1st. Thanks to Carl McGrath, Leo

Lalley, Leslie Corte-Real, Neil Pignatano and Jeff Maddy for their great leadership and commitment as members of the Bridge. All but Jeff and Leo will be continuing in their roles as we move into 2023-2024. Jeff and Leo have decided to take an official break after years of service, though they will continue to be valuable resources. Debi Swift and Jill Berger will share the Administrative Officer position and John Swift will become our new Executive Officer.

We also have a very solid group on our Executive Committee. This includes new members Richard Apfel, Jim Humphrey, Curt Collins, and Lee Corte-Real. Veterans Nancy Maddy, Connie Farmer, Jerry Ferrell, Jill Berger, Craig Buechler and Scott Fergen will also continue to serve.

We are still looking for folks who would like to work with the leadership as assistants and successors for key roles and committees. We have quite a few new members and we'd really like to get others involved. New people bring new ideas and we are always open to changes for the better.

We went into 2022-2023 thinking we'd have a normal year, especially after Covid. Things didn't quite work out that way. Before I talk about the current situation, let me recap some of the accomplishments of the past year. It's easy to forget all the progress we made before September 28th. We streamlined our meeting schedule while maintaining monthly social events. We now have four general meetings versus 10. Our by-laws were rewritten and updated, as we had been operating under by-laws approved in 2016. Our education group was conducting a lot of great classes and we had a robust schedule inclusive of many advanced classes. We added a couple of instructors and our ABC team continued to set the bar

for the best program in the country. Our rental program was going great and we were renting the banquet room on almost every weekend. We restarted orientation sessions for new members, restarted a few ABC graduation dinners and potlucks. Our entertainment group planned and conducted some really fun social events and we implemented a new system to streamline reservations and payments. We added Weekdayers to our boating groups, in addition to Weekenders. Co-op charting, fishing, kayaking and C&R also had great events and outings. We conducted a hurricane seminar at the Westin that was well attended. This proved to be very timely and beneficial. Last, but not least, we had numerous captains and members involved in the filming of different segments for America's Boating Channel. Suffice it to say we had a lot of changes and many accomplishments.

Our current situation includes rebuilding and restarting. We are planning to restart Co-op Charting on a limited basis. As most know, we've lost a large number of markers in Cape Coral and Lee County. The Coast Guard has done a pretty good job of getting their ATONs replaced. We are starting to conduct some classes. We've got a few advanced classes and seminars scheduled in March and we are looking at the timing to resume ABC. Our banquet room, office and conference room are functional thanks to all the hard work from our members. We have received an advance from our insurance company and our roof installation is underway. We are in the process of planning next steps. It will take months before we get the second floor back in shape.

We are going to resume office hours on a limited basis. Our plan is to start in early March. Keep an eye out for email and website announcements. We are also looking to better understand our communication methods and delivery systems. We have multiple methods to forward information. The key is to get you what you need in a format that does not create redundancy or overload.

You'll see in this issue that we have a District 22 meeting on Saturday, April 22nd. The National Chief Commander will be speaking at this event for those who may want to attend. It should be interesting.

Thanks to all of you for your efforts in 2022-2023 and I look forward to a great 2023-2024.




