COMMANDER'S REPORT

I had the pleasure last night of hosting our annual Merit Mark social and dinner. We had around 75 folks earn merit marks last and we had a great turnout of about 50 people for our recognition event. We wouldn't exist without all the efforts from our members and volunteers. Thank You!

A question has come up about Merit Mark certificates. National does not send a certificate. They started a process where they send you an email and you print your own. This may have gone into your junk folder if you haven't seen the note. Some were received as far back as November. If you are looking for yours this is the first place I'd check. Regardless, the records on the National site should be correct.

Switching from National to District, you'll note the invitation to attend the District 22 Conference on April 21 and 22. This is the semiannual meeting. We'd like to get them to change to one annual meeting and even do that via Zoom, but so far we are in the minority. Regardless, if someone wants to attend you are welcome and we'll reimburse you for lunch. Just let me know by April 11th. The national commander is going to be the guest speaker for the luncheon.

We are still in the endless loop of dealing with our insurance carrier. We've received about 50% of what we believe we deserve and it's been 6 months. We've created a very thorough record of the interactions and are reviewing next steps. Email can be a wonderful thing because we have a written documents. It's probably not so good for our carrier. That said, we are starting discussions with a legal advisor to see what we can do to get what we feel we deserve. We feel confident we can cover everything completed to date and the completion of the first floor. It's wait and see for the second floor. We just need to be patient, though that's not one of my strengths. Our roof replacement is underway. iRoof started last week and they hope to be finished next week. It looks like they are doing a good job and the new codes and requirements should give us a more robust structure. Hopefully it won't be tested in the foreseeable future.

I believe we are in the temporary "new normal" phase of post Ian. We've started classes again and we have had some meetings and social events. It's not perfect but we're making progress. ABC is scheduled for April 10th , but we may push this back if we can get a finisher and painter lined up to do the first floor in April. Terry Rosenstrauch, our building manager, has been doing a great job getting quotes and keeping things moving forward. We can't have classes and construction going on simultaneously. We'll decide in the next few days.

Boating groups have been active and we plan to kick off Co-op charting in the middle of the month. We'll be very cautious and safe, but I'm sure it will still be an adventure. We'll start with local runs and prioritize the areas where we boat the most.

We've got some good social events upcoming. Mini-golf is scheduled for April 13th, we've got a brunch planned for May 7th and a baseball outing planned for June 3rd. Does a mussel really instill fear in their opposition? That's something to ponder.

The office is open on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 9am until noon. If someone needs something outside of these hours just send us a note or call and we'll see what we can do to accommodate you. We're overloaded with life jackets and have some we want to give away permanently. If you need a couple to keep permanently let us know. We have a surplus pile in the conference room. The racks are full.

Here's hoping everyone has a great April.

Carbon monoxide poisoning – Know the signs

The Coast Guard annually reports that carbon monoxide poisoning is one of the main contributors to deaths on the water. Carbon monoxide is an odorless, colorless gas that is part of combustion engine exhausts. "Northerners" worry about it in their homes, but while out enjoying a day on the water it can be the last thing on our minds to worry about.

The symptoms of carbon monoxide poising include; dizziness, nausea, weakness, watering eyes, ears ringing, and red skin. Carbon monoxide will cause light-headedness, headaches, drowsiness, and loss of motion leading to loss of consciousness. It is easy to confuse some of the early symptoms with too much sun, and being tired. So, the symptoms can be easy to ignore.

A recent case of carbon monoxide poisoning involved the untimely death of a 21-year-old, while vacationing with her friends. The individual had been lounging in the rear-facing built-in seats on the swim platform at the back of a boat. After a while she decided to go for a quick swim and unfortunately, she never made it back to the boat. The coroner ruled that the cause of death was drowning, with carbon monoxide intoxication as contributing cause.

The driver of the boat had not turned off the engine and it had been idling while the passengers were resting. It's likely the person sitting in the swim platform seats was starting to experience the effects of the carbon monoxide gases and perhaps thought a quick dip would clear her head.

Since the boat was not moving exhaust gases likely built up under the swim platform. Upon entering the water, the last breath taken by the swimmer may have included enough carbon monoxide to cause her to pass out.

Two key factors contributed to this accident. The driver of the boat let the engine idle while they were taking a break. The passenger was sitting in a seat that was not a "designated seating area". According to the boat manufacturer, the seats built into the swim platform were not to be used while the engines idled. They warned passengers to "Stay away from the swim platform area while the engines are running." The warning was in both the user manual and stated clearly on warning decals affixed next to the seats.

Locally, boaters can suffer the effects of carbon monoxide poisoning when their vessel is moving through the water. This is most likely to be experienced running through the Shell Point manatee slow zone.

With smaller vessels carbon monoxide poisoning can be caused in a couple of ways. First, it can happen if the wind is from behind the vessel and is slightly faster than the speed the vessel is traveling. In this situation exhaust gases are pushed into the boat. Another way it can happen is called the "station wagon" effect when the windshield of the boat creates a low-pressure system that allows the exhaust gases to be drawn into the back of the boat.

On larger vessels, with a cabin, the same low-pressure zone can be created, pulling the exhaust gases over the transom and into the cabin filling it with carbon monoxide. To prevent this from occurring, vessels with a cabin should keep a port open near the bow to allow fresh air to pass through the cabin.

If you feel any of the common symptoms listed above, get yourself and your passengers into free-flowing fresh air. It can be simple as having your passengers move to the front of the boat, and you stepping off to one side, out from behind the windshield.

OPERATION DRY WATER July 1 – 3, 2023

Boating under the influence (BUI) continues to be a major factor in incidents and deaths on our nation's waterways. Organizations and outreach partners are teaming up for Operation Dry Water, a national boating under the influence awareness and enforc

The 2023 Operation Dry Water heightened awareness and enforcement three-day weekend is July 1 - 3, prior to the Fourth of July – a holiday known for impaired boating, and deadly incidents.

The National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA), and the U.S. Coast Guard are joining together in an intensified effort to educate boaters about boating under the influence and safe boating practices.

- Operation Dry Water is a year-round boating under the influence awareness campaign.
- Organizations and law enforcement agencies from all 56 U.S. states and territories participate in Operation Dry Water, and in the heightened awareness and enforcement weekend.
- Launched in 2009 by the NASBLA in partnership with the United States Coast Guard, Operation Dry Water has been a highly successful effort to draw public attention to the dangers of BUI of alcohol and drugs.
- Alcohol is the leading contributing factor in recreational boating deaths and a major factor in incidents on the water.
- BUI is illegal. Operating a recreational vessel with a blood alcohol concentration (BAC) of .08 or higher is against Florida law.For more information, boaters can access <u>operationdry-water.org</u>, <u>uscgboating.org</u>.
