# COMMANDER'S REPORT

Welcome to June, the traditional start of hurricane season and the gateway to our usual July – August pause. Unfortunately, our message is that nothing continues, likely through September. The

Bridge reviewed current guidance and prognosis in mid May, and decided that continuing our suspension of Squadron and rental activities made the most sense.

There will be no squadron related meetings or education classes scheduled from June to September. At the moment, we are unable to schedule our traditional Summer gathering. Should the outlook improve, we will announce something via the website and by email. Our rental program, suspended since mid March, has been cleared through the end of June and will likely not resume before September, or later.

Guidelines for large gathering venues such as bars and wedding events are still being developed by the state. Anything requiring social distancing (6 ft) and frequent real time disinfecting associated with close management oversight does not align well with our traditional mode of operation. For the protection of our customers and for those members who provide support, such as meeting set up and room rearrangement, we will remain closed to rentals until we figure out the new normal. Nothing supersedes the safety of our members and the security of our facility.

We entered this new fiscal year with a strong base. Although we will not meet our budget objectives for the current year, the long term looks good right now. While we will minimize spending where possible, it is really the income side that has taken the most significant hit.

Speaking of finances, we want to recognize the work of Ida Rubio's audit team, who reports elsewhere in this edition. Thanks! We will file our Form 990 over the summer. The audit report details will be available at the Squadron

office when it reopens. We wish safe travels to all members about to wander. Many have already settled into their northern nests. For those who call SWFL home, you can look forward to even less traffic on the roads and just enough space in the restaurants you wish to visit.

Please keep in touch with close friends, and let us know if someone needs a hand or a delivery of something special. Be as generous as possible when visiting restaurants. We want all our favorite locations to weather this storm. Also please keep in mind the thousands of folks still needing the help of local food banks. Please support the Cape Coral Caring Center or other area organizations fighting hunger. Your Commander will soon fly away to his island fishing camp in central New Hampshire, but is always available via email and sometimes cell. **Hurricane Resources** We will not be able to run our hurricane prep seminar this year. Our website has hurricane resource information at <https://www.ccsaps.org/hurricane-info>. The Manatee Squadron pages are more localized, but you will find all the BoatUS pages to be very informative, and include several different worksheets. You might also find the USPS on-line seminar useful. If you plan to anchor or tie off in protected water (or center of canal), figure out you plan now and order the necessary lines.

There are no hard and fast answers here, use forecast information, make a plan, implement it and MAYBE tweak it if storm tracking changes before landfall. Do not plan on making mid-storm adjustments and do NOT assume power will be on when you need it.

Those of us living on Cape Coral canals have some unique decisions that may not be covered in instructions aimed at anchoring in semi protected inlets. First, check with your insurance carrier. If they say do something, do it. Some seem to say "not on a lift", others are silent. If the choice is up to you ask neighbors with similar boats for suggestions and their experience. If you have a full cover for your boat, check recommendations from

the cover manufacturer. If you chose to leave your boat on lift, raise it to about pool height if you can. There is no magic in that height, but if the surge level raised the canal to pool height, where your boat ends up is likely trivial compared to other issues. Do secure the boat so it stays in the area that translates to long spring lines.

If you choose to not use a lift, evaluate creative tie-off strategies that can handle forecasted positive surge, But be mindful of Irma, who changed her mind and delivered record breaking negative surge, draining many of the canals for a few hours. It's too late at that point to call a dredge, so assume your boat will settle into the muck. Just don't leave it tied too tight so it dangles from the piles. Commanders experience, not necessarily a recommendation: My 22Klb 38 Sport fish has survived Charlie and Irma up on a 25K lift. If you leave the boat on the lift, place fore to aft spring lines on the lift structure to the far piling, limiting fore to aft swing. To get an initial idea, watch your boat during summer thunderstorms to see how wind creates motion.

**June Maintenance Tip** Many of us have garden hoses located at or near the dock for easy wash-down. I recall many years ago returning from a summer stay up north, finding my hoses looking like black snakes (we have those too) and coiled on the hose hanger. At first I thought bleach would be the solution, assuming black mold, but my first attempt was unimpressive. I believe what we are dealing with here is a black algae, the stuff that also seems to like tile roofs near the water. Solution? Get yourself a 5 gal bucket, and neatly coil your hose into the bucket, bottom to top. I can easily get a 50ft hose into a bucket with careful placement. Now fill the remaining area in the bucket with 2/3 water, 1/3 Wet'nForget (Costco, Sams, Home Depot). Let it soak 2 or three days, then grab two or three shop towels and wipe down the hose slowly, pulling it through your hands. It won't look perfect at first, but over next week or so it will improve further. Alternate solution, put hose in trash and buy a new one.

# STAY HYDRATED ON THE WATER

America's Boating Class covers lots of topics of interest to boaters across the nation. One topic of relevance to boaters in SWFL that gets no mention is heat stress. Our ABC instructors have added some material about heat stress to their class presentation, as it can and it does affect many boaters down here if they don't stay hydrated while out on the water.

There are two types of heat stress; one is caused by water depletion, and the other by salt depletion. Boaters experiencing water depletion show signs of excessive thirst, weakness, and headache, which if left untreated can lead to loss of consciousness. The symptoms of salt depletion include nausea and vomiting, muscle cramps, and dizziness.

Heat stress can be easily avoided by making sure you bring plenty of water with you and drinking it while

you are out on the water. Don't wait until you start feeling symptoms. Water is both the prevention and the cure. Caffeinated drinks, and alcohol contribute to heat stress because they are diuretics that cause you to lose water. People in class chuckle when we tell them that on our boats, all you will find is water. We assure them that once our boat is docked at home we, too, enjoy a fine adult beverage or two. If you have not been drinking enough water there are other things you can do to cool down if you start feeling the effects of heat stress. These actions include removing any tight or unnecessary clothing. Soak a cloth or towel in cool water and put it around your neck. Get off the water and hop into your pool.

Be sure to monitor your passengers, if any are exhibiting the symptoms of heat stress. Hand them a water and tell them to drink it. You want them to enjoy their trip, not suffer through it.

ABC class have been cancelled until next fall. Due to the pandemic, we didn't hold classes for three months, so it would be great to have a full September class. Unfortunately, when we restart ABC, we plan on limiting the class size to 50% of the current capacity for the classroom. This means we can only accept the first 30 students who sign up. Don't forget to tell a friend, new neighbor, and your fellow boaters about the benefits of starting or restarting their boating experience down here by signing up for ABC early so they get a seat. And don't forget we have a lot of other great offerings that will resume in the fall. Watch for announcements.
