CCSAPS BUILDING DAMAGED BY HURRICANE IAN Building Closed Until Further Notice

Cooperative Project Between CCSAPS and the Marine Volunteer Unit of the Cape Coral Police Department

At the CCSAPS September General Membership Meeting, Larry Embrey (Manager) and Tommy Senatore (Training Supervisor) provided an informative overview of Cape Coral Police Department's Marine Volunteer Unit (CCPD-MVU). The speakers pointed out that there is a nice fit and spirit of cooperation between our organizations. We both help maintain the beauty and safety of our waterways by educating citizens on water safety, boating etiquette, and applicable laws and ordinances.

Hurricane Ian's winds and surges

not only damaged our homes, boat lifts, and docks, but also waterway aids to navigation (ATON) which mark channel boundaries, entrances, zones, and dangers. THE CCPD-Special Operations Bureau, under the Command of Sergeant Chuck Caruso, was given the responsibility to visually inspect and photograph ATONs belonging to the City of Cape Coral from the Yacht Club to Tarpon Point (West). His crews also filled out United States Coast Guard (USCG) Auxiliary Inspection Reporting Forms for each of the 71 ATONS. This team includes both regular officer and volunteer marine units.

Power Squadron members Russ Hind and Jim Humphrey are also CCPD-MVU crew members on Larry and Tommy's crew. They surveyed the Redfish Point Rim Channel, the Cape Coral Yacht Basin, and the Cape Coral Boat Ramp ATONs. Jim is under training as a First Mate on the CCSAPS Cooperative Charting Team (CoOp). Before Ian, CCSAPS CoOp crews completed many ATON surveys as they have for years, and provided USCG, Lee County, and City

of Cape Coral reports which were then used to replace and repair many navigational aids.

Following the hurricane, CCSAPS Commander Scott Steele authorized the sharing of CoOp Charting survey data as needed. This ATON Survey



effort provides the possibility of FEMA reimbursement to the City of Cape Coral for replacing defective ATONS; expenses that would otherwise be funded by the city. COMMANDER'S REPORT

As I think back over the past 3.5 months, it's been a blur, and not always the good kind. I'm pretty much set us all back in one way or another. But

before I get back into that subject let's highlight a few of the good things from 2022.

We started off the year on a positive note. Having survived Covid, we were really starting to build some positive momentum. We assembled another great group of leaders, committee members and a strong executive committee. Membership has stayed steady and we've added quite a few creative and helpful resources to the squadron. One of our first accomplishments was to revise the bylaws, simplify some processes and reduce the number of general meetings from 10 to 4 per year. Social activities remained monthly and we've continued to have a lot of fun and fellowship. We also reintroduced Squadron orientation sessions for new members.

Education continues to be the foundation of our squadron and we've accomplished a lot. We ran ABC through the summer and graduated a tremendous number of new and safe boaters. Advanced courses were also conducted and received a great response. Neil and his instructors are second to none, and we are well respected in the broader community. Everyone should be proud of our ongoing commitment.

Boating groups, the entertainment

committee, vessel safety checks, coop charting and all of our other groups were very active and productive through August. As you'll note on page 1, our coop charting group has worked closely with other agencies to improve navigation and boater safety.

Then the sh*t hit the fan on September 28th. Though it was devastating, we've made some progress. The temporary roof is holding up pretty well. The new roof is on order and we're waiting on an update as to installation. We've had a great group of folks working on room 101. We've got new drywall up and much of the electrical has been improved. The office is also getting back in shape. There are a lot of other fixes that have been made along the way. Taping, mudding and some finishing are next on our list. We are usually getting a crew together once a week to work on the building. I can't thank Carl McGrath and Larry Rich enough for coming in most days, developing a plan and acquiring materials. Zack Seevers has also been instrumental. Many others also deserve thanks and hopefully you've seen them listed in my previous updates. We've been in touch with our insurance carrier and think we are very close to getting the claim estimate and an advance. It's been a slow process. I'm sure many of you have the same issues. Ideally, we'd like to get some functionality back by early February.

Before I talk about what's upcoming, I want to thank everyone for hanging in there. I realize some have asked the question, "Why am I a member when we aren't doing things at the squadron?" It's a good question and I can only respond by saying we have a temporary interruption to normalcy. We've still been boating, we've still had some social

functions, we've still been meeting and most importantly, we've seen the teamwork and efforts from everyone to get things back to normal. As I've said previously, we survived 18 months of Covid. We'll survive IAN reconstruction.

As to upcoming events, things will start to get busier. We've got a group participating in the Fort Myers Boat show in early January. Another group of would be movie stars will be filming with America's Boating Channel the week of January 24th. We have 10 boats and numerous members involved. Nominations are coming for next year's officers, we are developing a rough budget for next year, education is revising their calendar for 2023 and the entertainment committee is putting together some future festive events. Meanwhile, our boating groups are getting back into action after the holidays. Our next general meeting is February 9th 2023. We will have it at the Squadron. It's important that we have a quorum of members to approve the budget and nominations. More information will be forthcoming. Our Change of Watch is planned for February 24th. It will probably be sometime in March for our Merit Mark recognition and dinner.

Again, let me thank everyone for their continued involvement and support of our organization. Hopefully we've been through our 100 year flood event (500 year event?) and we'll see a calmer 2023 and beyond.

Is it Really 2023?

Happy New Year! Here is hoping 2023 is a quiet one.

Hopefully all of those with boats will soon be able to get back out on the waterways. Some folks have taken tentative trips out to survey the waters and the coastal damage. No matter what you choose to do, venture out or wait a bit more, there are a few things you can be doing.

Now would be a good time to schedule a free vessel safety check. Some of our members are still certified to do this. This is an easy way to make sure you still have all of the federally required safety equipment on board and it is up to date. They may even be able update you about the status of the waters in your area.

The State of Florida has enacted some new regulations and requirements that will go into effect January 1, 2023, that impact our certified instructors of America's Boating Course. Due to an increase in boating accidents involving passengers falling overboard there are some topics the state wants addressed in class.

The state is now mandating that all basic boating education classes stress to students the danger associated with passengers sitting on anything that is not designated by the manufacturer for seating. This includes seat backs, gunwale, transom, bow, and motor cover. When the boat is in motion it is too easy to fall overboard and being stricken by the boat's propeller or another vessel.

Florida has **not** elected to place a fine on those people engaging in those activities, so in essence they are not "illegal" in the sense you can get a ticket for them. However, you might get stopped and get a stern talking to. Perhaps our legislators believe the consequences of falling overboard are enough of a penalty as it usually results in severe injury or

death. Propellers are not forgiving.

In addition, instructors are required to remind students that anytime there is someone in the water near the boat, the engine should be turned off. When you are attempting to retrieve a person from the water be sure to approach from downwind. You do this to keep the vessel from being blown into the person in the water. Once you are close, turn off the engine before the person gets near the rear of the vessel. Having the boarding ladder next to the propeller makes this a dangerous place if you leave the engine running.

It is also a good idea to turn the engine off when passengers are boarding or disembarking. Too many accidents happen at the dock and again you don't want anyone injured by a rotating propeller.

OK, I know what you are thinking, if the boat is in neutral what danger does the propeller hold. In both situations above, you will have people moving around inside the boat. If one of those people lose their balance there is a chance that they might accidentally put the engine in gear putting the propeller in motion. Don't scoff, it happens.

In the November issue of The Buoys, we discussed the new law governing peer-to-peer boat rentals. That law also goes into effect on January 1, 2023. If you are thinking about renting your boat to others, be sure to read Florida Statute "127 327.54 Liveries; safety regulations; penalty". Copies this can be found online.

TIME TO GET YOUR ANNUAL VESSEL SAFETY CHECK (VSC)

Even if you pay careful attention to safety, dangerous mechanical problems can crop up on the best-maintained boat. That's why the U.S. Coast Guard recommends that all recreational boaters (including personal watercraft users) take advantage of the free Vessel Safety Check (VSC) program every year. VSCs are offered by experienced members of the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and the United States Power Squadrons, two of the nation's premiere volunteer boating safety organizations.

A VSC is your best way of learning about problems that might put you in violation of state or federal laws or worse, create danger for you or your passengers on the water.

Introduction to Charting/Navigation will take place on February 23 at 7 PM for two hours.

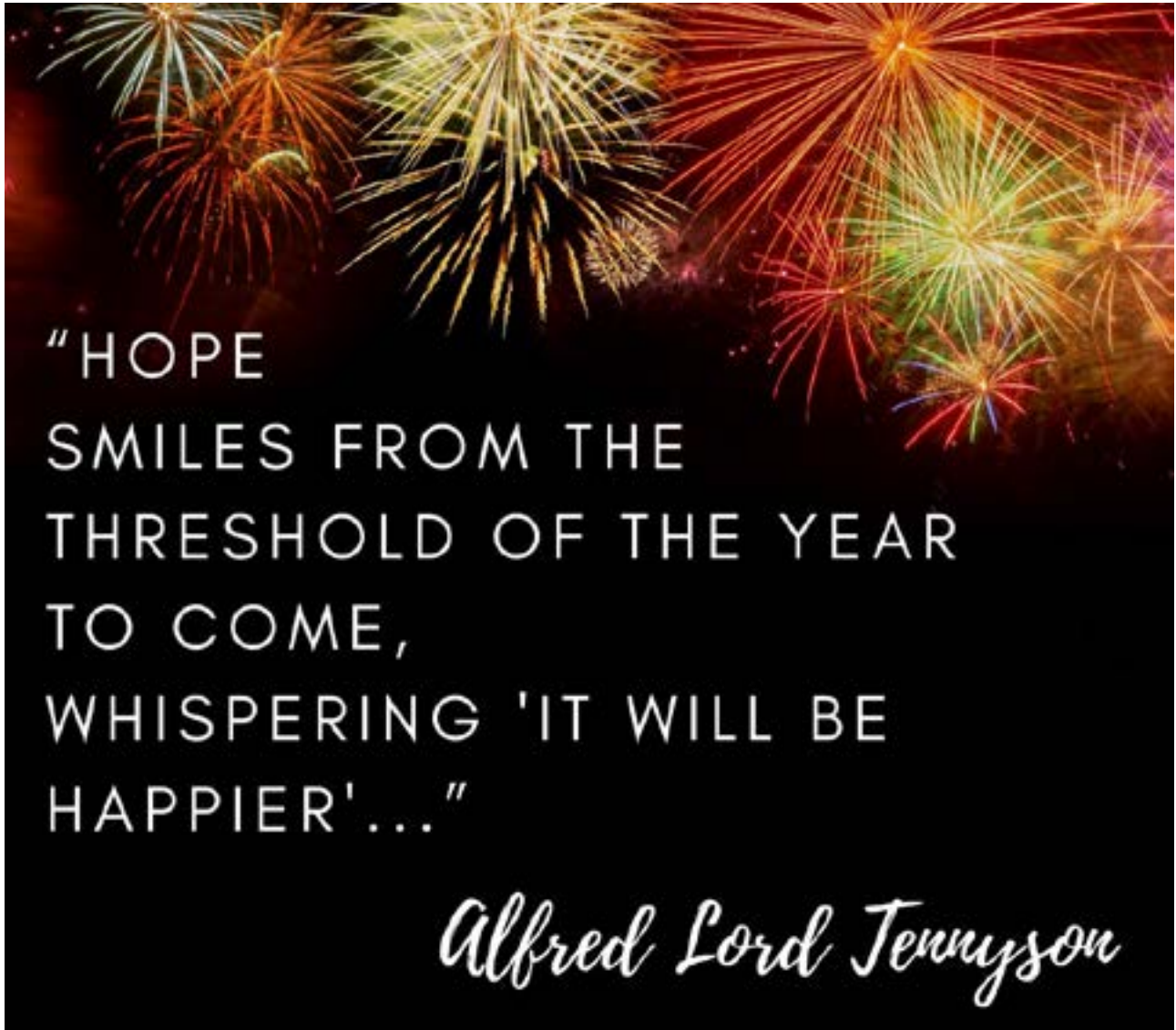
